Translator's Notes

For those of you who are not familiar with the German language, and even less familiar with the peculiarities of this 1735 document, I have included these notes that I hope will make it easier to understand.

- The Neuffer name appears in various forms and spellings throughout the text. In Middle German, gender marking on last names is done by adding 'in' to the family name to indicate a female. So Neuffer becomes Neufferin, Harpprecht becomes Harpprechtin etc. That ending is dropped in modern German, but I have left the names in this document as written originally.
- This document contains many references to professions, religious vocations, and ordinary jobs. I have translated the references that appear in German. However, most of these references are to academia, ecclesiastical callings, and matters of the realm and appear in latin. If the meaning is clear, I have rendered it into English, if not, I have italicized the latin which contain numerous abbreviations.
- There are also many citations of primary sources which I have copied as faithfully as I could in spite of the numerous abbreviations. These citations also appear in italics and often end in a page number.
- Male names that are preceded by "D." are presumed to have the title Doctor. Male names that are preceded by "M." are involved in the ecclesiastical clergy.
- In the original book, 3 pedigree charts are shown on large sheets and the text gets progressively small as one reads down the chart. In order to make the charts easier to read, I have divided each one into levels and identified the parent and children of each succeeding generation. This textual format allows the reader to view each family group in an easy to understand way.
- I used the symbol (?) to indicate word(s) that are illegible or not decipherable.
- I have attempted to translate this old document accurately, but with all such translations, there may be some mistakes due to the archaic vocabulary and of course, human error.

(Tab. I Nr. 7)

Notes to Table I

Nr. 1 This is the clan father of the entire Neuffer family which has been scattered so widely from the family home in Münsingen. D. Müller, (*Prof. Med. Tüb.*) wrote in his book, (*Orat. Fun D. Seb. Blof-*) that many capable men and families have come from this little town, (*ex equo Troj,*) among which is especially found the name Neuffer. My work on Münsingen found that nearly 100 years ago the father of this Johann Neifers, whose name is Hanns Martin was found in a very old court book. What was not discovered was who this Hanns Martin was.

2. *Conf. D. Christ Befold. Laudat. Fun obit. D. Johann Valent Neufferei.*) This Martin Neifers wife N. N. and her sister Aebtissin from Gnadenzell, were mortal enemies with Luther and his teachings, and tried with all their strength to persuade their son and nephew, (*de quo nr. seq. 3*) away from the gospel.

3. He was the very first on in the Neuffer family to embrace the teachings of Luther and the gospel of Jesus Christ. In the *Matricul. Facult. Philof. Tub.* he is called Johann Nifer from Münsingen. On the 21 of July 1527 he graduated from Tübingen (University) Duke Ulrich (*gl.mem*) gave him (1519) a vicarage position at the monastery in Stuttgart. From Kaiser Carl V, as the Austrian aristocracy in Württemberg was given over, he was called to the seminary in Herrenberg. After he had studied the scriptures diligently, always growing in the faith of Luther, he gave up his study of his own free will and became head of the Neippergischer House in Pfortsheim. After Duke Ulrich's restitution, he was called back from Pfortzheim to become the first Lutheran monastery and cellar overseer in Herrenberg, and at the same time, caretaker of the monasteries Roseck, Sindelfingen and head of the Kniebis(?). For many years he was able to accomplish all this through hard work. He died on aet. 83. Befold 1 c.

4. Their father was Johann Seber (not Scher, as some old *Apograph* the friends have in error stated), caretaker of the monastery in Herrenberg when it was still under the control of the pope. Befold.

5. He served und three Württembergian aristocrats, namely, Duke Christoph, Duke Ludwig, and Duke Friderich , who showed much mercy: especially Duke Friderich who bestow upon him in his old age a nice pension (*Victalito*). Befold

6. Their father was Valentin Moser, who was appointed by the synod at Pfortsheim at 16 years , to study at Herrenberg. Born October 6, 1520, knighted 1572. D 4. Mart. Ob. Died 2 May 1576. The mother Margareta was born 13 July, 1518, died 13 July, 1559. Marci Hillers, a daughter, was also once a student at Herrenberg. Their grandparents were Balthasar Moser III. Born 15 June 1478 and died 28 July, 1552, a member of the Würtemberger Chamber council, and Apollonia Winzelhauserin. The great grandfather of Balthasar Moser II, *cognomento Marstaller* (master horse stall keeper), for the county of Württemberg. Died 1497. The great- great-grandfather Balthasar Moser I, held the same position and war councilor who lived circa 1448. Conf. government councilor Moser from Fileck appears on the Württemberg P. I Moser pedigree chart.

7. Was the first one to start spelling the name Neyffer instead of Neifer, while friends and descendents prefer the Neuffer spelling. In 1594 he was *ex gratia Sereniff. Princ. Ludovici hopfes* in the newly built Colleg. III. He received from his *Profocero D. Vabren bübler* in 1598. *Miram Doct.* Afterward he was in 1600 *Prof.*

Feudal. In Ill. Colleg and Affeff. Dicat-- Finally also in 1604 he was appointed ab Ampliff. Senat Acad. Professor, of law, Canon and Pandect the University. Died Podagra tetrograda, an. Aet 38. Conf. acad, Witte Diary. Biograph . & Menckens learned *Lexie.P.H p.m. 176* which spelled the name Nepffer instead of Neuffer which was completely wrong. His father Ludwig, lived 14 years longer than he did. Bef. Id. C. According to his epitaph, he was a brilliant lawyer, a true Christian and beloved by all who were true to the faith. Therefore he was called *bona perennisque fama pietatis innocentie*. From Professor Pregizer praising God words in 1721.p.476. Heinrich Wellingius painted his portrait, which I the author, have included with the following passage: *Talis erat facies Neyfferi Jure valentis quo vix ullus ert Integritate prior*. NB. From this D. Johann Valentin Neuffer and D. Martin Neuffer de quo Tabul II & III. The Neufferish friendship divided into the Valentin-ish and the Martin-ish lines.

8. The parents were: Anton Vahrenbühler, born 1555. SS. TH D. Pastor to the royal court in Stuttgart and afterwards prelate to Hirfau, died 7 May, 1591. And sibna, D. Johann Vilchers, *Med. Prof. P. Tübingen* and Sybils Henßin from Nürnberg Daughter. Also she was the granddaughter D. Nocol. Vahrenbühli, born in Lindau in 1519. Jcti. & Prof. P. Tübingen celeberrimi, who in 1604 at age 85 died. And Regina Waltherin, *Patrit. August. V. Befold.(?)* Who is from this Nie. Vahrenbühler noted, that he not alone in 1597, his *Jubileum Matrim memorabilia folennitate celebrat, vid. Fischel Biography P. 1 page 312*. Rather also 90 children, grandchildren, great-grandchildren attended. *S Predgizer Poes. Ad. An 1719. P 403 & Menck. Learned lexicon, P.II. p.m. 1357*

9. She had three children with her husband who all died young. Her father was Eberhard Behr, *J.U.D.* and (?) caretaker in Stuttgart.

10. Parents were: Salamo Frisch, *J.U. Lic. & Advoc. Die alt.* and Barbara who was born a Megerlinin, from whom also the present day and well respected Fritsch -ish family in Stuttgart descended. She, Susanna after the death of her first husband, D. Johann Jacob Bauren, Mayor of Tübingen and court *Ger also lcouncilor* for the surrounding land, who after 46 years of marriage and the birth of 6 sons. Feil Johann Jacob Baur, *U.J.D.* high court died in 1688. Johann Ulrich Baur, *J.U.Cand.* once at the Cloister Hofweister at Pfullingen. Thomas Baur, formerly church councilor, *Exped. Rath of the defendence* and all respects flourished. The others died when young. She, Susanna survived until she was 76 years old and had 63 grandchildren and 13 great-grandchildren that survived. *Vid.D.Joh.Ad.Ofiand, Cancell. Tübingen. Conc.fun. & Perfon in ipfius obitum.*

11. About him there is nothing more that is known, except that he in 1619 under the *D.Befoldo over the IV part of the land rights ann. Aet. 14. Difpurirt has. Mft. & Moser ad Annal. Cruf.*

12. The parents were: Joseph Schlotterbeck, general superintendant and prelate to Maulbronn, who died on 21 May, 1669, at 78 years. Anna Maria, M. Johann Krompeinen, Pastor at Benhingen daughter. *Fischl. Biogr.P.II p.169*

13., Parents: M. Wolfgang Heinrich Majer, Pastor at Nabern, *per 55. Ann. Ob. 1711.* & Anna Barbara Müllerin from Urach.

14. They are the following: Philipp Jacob Neuffer, *scrib.* Died in Tübingen 1726. Thomas Friderich Neuffer, Apothecary, who lived for many years in France and Italy and is assumed to be dead. Johanna Elisabeth Neufferin died single in 1700.

Sophia Gertrauta Neufferin, Franz Rothen, citizens and grain dealers in Hanlbroun, a widow who was left behind without children. The others died when they were small.

15. Was the son of Johann Rudolph Camerer, *Medic. Candid. & Pharmacop.* Tübingen and Agnetis Schoenin, The daughter of Elia Schönen, apothecary in Tübingen. The grandchild of Johann Rudolf Camerer, *Med. D. und Physici* in Reutlingen: A great-granddaughter of Alexander Camerer, *Med. D. and Physici* also in Reutlingen. *Conf. Progr. Fun. Elia Rud. Camer. Item D. kellers Orat. Fu. In hunc obit. & Pregiz. Poes. Ad ann 1723. P. 476*

16. Father was D. Johann Krafft, Councilor and senior bishop in Alpirsbach, born 1618. Died 30 Jan. 1695 who held the office of Deacons *Facult. Phiof. Tübingen, succetlive 300. Magistres creirt.* His writings were held in high regard in other countries and even appeared in Rome and read with enthusiasm. He had important positions outside of Württemberg. *Fischl.Biogr. P.II p 274.* The mother was Regina Maria Beerin, the daughter of Johann Georg Beeren, a member of the high court in Tübingen. *Fiscl.c.l.*

17. Parents Johann Zeller, *D. & Prof. Med.* Tübingen & Archiat. Württemberg & Oeting. Ob. Died 7 April 1734 and Christina Dorothea Bardilinin, died 20 January, 1719. Grandparents Johann Zeller, General Superindendant and senior bishop at Maulbronn; died 2 August 1694 an.aet.74 minist.50 and Anna Maria Geißelin from Calw, died 9 August 1687 Ifr Grandparents M. Johannes Zeller, Pastor at Rotfelden and Beatrix Bloffin. Great, great grandparents M. Johann Zeller the elder, also pastor in Rothfelden, who in 1580 was a signer of the *Formul Concord and Walburga Hagin.* The clan elders: Johann Zeller, master builder, who with his father Conrad Zeller rebuilt the fortress Hohen Zwiel under Duke Uhlrich, *gl. Mem. Vid. Johan Zeller, Prof and evening pastor in Tübingen preacher and personal. In mort. D. Johannes Zeller, Leib Medic. Pregiz. Poes. Ad ann. 1733. P. 289 & Menck. Taught. Lex. P. II. P.m. 1610*

18. Parents: Johann Christoph Gerlach, *d. Med. Archiat.* County and city- Physicus at Calw. Born 2 October 1670. Died 1717 and Maria Catharina D.Mich. Müllers, Cancell. Tübingen. daughter. Grandparents: M. Elisaus Gerlach, Pator at Mittelstatt and Juliana Margareta Camererin. Great grandfather, D. Samuel Gerlach, Special to Göppingen. Great, Great grandfather Stephan Gerlach, *SS.Th.Prof.& Pro CANCELL.* Tübingen. Born in Knittlingen from Stephan Gerlach, Stonecutter, the same in the year 1546, the year in which the holy Dr. Luther died. From this *Pro Cancellario* Stephan Gerlachen it is known that he was sent for 6 years in the service of Baron David Ungnad from Sonneg, for the Emporer Maximillian II. To the Ottomann stronghold, as his Rens, Pr. (representative?) in Constantinopel , where he came to a greater realization of Jesus Christ, Savior of the world. He had the opportunity to correspond for the Tübingen Theologorum and give them the Greek language Patriarchen JEREMIA , which was also *Aug. Confeff. & Compend. Theol. D. Heebr* from translated by Martino Crusio into the Greek language. And after he was sent to Constantinopel, He died 30 January 1612, *vid.Theopl.Spizel.TemplHonor. Referat. P.25.sq.Fischl.P.I.p.202 feq. Moser, Erldutert. Würtemb. P.I.p.288.seq.nen non Wilh.*

Adam Drommers, Probstens Denchendorff, *tr.Spec.* at Calw, Gerlachische funeral sermon.

19. Belonging: Regina Magdalena Camererin, and Agnes Christina Camererin, remained single next 6. Children *utriusque fexus*, who preceded their parents in death, among them Maria Christina, through her early death 1715. This troubled the hearts of the parents.

20. This great man was for many years before his death, royal Swedish and Chur Sachsen church and *Confitorial* councilor, Württemberg. Geh. Coucilor, Direct. Confist. County Assesmf for Primarius and Pralat for Hirfau. His loyalty to the aristocracy, his patriotic courage, his outstanding love for the masses of the poor, service to Jesus Christ have earned him a place of glory in the next world. He was a son of the great cancellaru, D. Johann Adam Osland, *Theol Tub.Primar.* Who was a *miraculum inter eruditos fui evi* and Annae Magdalana Schipperrn: A grandson to M. Johann Balthasar Osianders, Diac. Vayhing. Great grandson of Johann Osiandes, Pralaten at Adelberg , great great grandson to Luca Osianders cort pastot in Stuttgart. Great great great grandson of Andres Osiandri, *Theol. Prof. Regiomontani Primarii*, who was born in 1498 at Gunzenhausen during the (?). *conf. Progr. Fun. Direct. Osiandr*, item high honors memorial to the dead, D. Johann Adam Osianders, & *Fischl. Biogr. P.I. p. 146. P. II p.285.*

21. Parents: The world famous, great *J ctrus, D. Michael Grafs, Comes Pal. Caef.Prof. p. o. Tub. Ill,Colleg. Affeff. & c.* Died 25 July, 1731 and Maria Barbara from the ancient and famous, Fromundin.-ish order. Died *conf. Progr. Acad. Fun.* After the death of D. Johann Rudolph Osiander, the remaining widow married Christian Heinrich Kornen, *JCrum, Ill. Confit, Vice Director Reg. Council* and Württemberg Crens standing confidant.

22. Father was Johann Christoph Wolffing. Chief in Tübingen and later in Stuttgart. The mother Anna Dorothea Baurin, died in 1699, Grandson of Georg Voffmanne, *Confist. Secreta.* The mother Anna Dorothea Springin, *conf. Personal. As ipf. Conc. Fun. Auth. D Reuchin.*

23. A son D. Gottfried Hoffman, *Theol. Prof. P. O. Tub. & Stip. Superindendant.* Died 8 December 1728, and Susanna Dorothea Baurin. Died 1699. Grandchild to Georg Hoffmann, Confist. Secretar. And Anna Catharina Klöpfferin, from Schwäbisch Hall. *Vid. Weissinannis. Leich. Pr. in obit. D. Hoffmann.* From the Hoffman-ish family the *Pregiß. Ad. An. 1728.p.584 fq. & Moser. Erläutert Württemberg p. II.p.207 feq. D.* Daniel Hoffmann had married the widow of the deceased Deacon of Herrenberg, Gottfried Hoppens, Catharina Tabitha, born Burgermeister.

24. This Andreas Adam Hochstetter was, in his time an example for the learned and intelligent as a pious theologian. His parents were the undying servants of the Württemberg church Theologus, D. Johann Andreas Hochstetter, born 15 March 1637, *Gener. Superintendent and prälate* at Bebenhausen, also many years Senior of the Württemberg area, Died 8 Nov. 1720 at 83 years of age. And Anna Catharina, M. Georg Lindens, *Superior Praeceptoris at Bebenh. Daughter. Vid. Prog. Acad. In ob.D.* Hochstetter and Fridrich Christoph Weißmann, Hochstetters. *Leich.Pred.* The grandfather was M. Conrad Hochstetter, *Spec. at Kirchheim*, born 1583. Died 10 Feb. 1661. at 78 years. *Ministerii 50 which tempore Decanntus 75. Pastores. Rarifsimo prorfus exemplo, investirt*, also from Duke Eberhard III. Who showed

extraordinary mercy to his 6 sons in the *stip. Theolog.* Are recorded. 3 were raised as *Dignitat, Praefular.* The great grandfather was Martin Hochstetter, Citizen and judge at Gerhausen, Blaubeurer office circa 1550. *Vid. M. Angelins, Diacon Kircho-Tecc. Funeral talk and Personal. In obitum Conr.Hochstett.adde.Fiseel.p.II.p.120.feq*

25. Parents Johann Eberhard Raesler, *Pholof. Pract. Prof. Publ. Ord. Stip. Ephor. & Paedagogarch.* Born 11 October 1668, Died 12 October 1733. And Maria Sibilla D. Mich. Mütters, Cancell. Tub. Daughter vid. Progr. Acad. And D. Weißmann Rösler. Funeral sermon.

26. Their father and grandfather: see in *Fischlin. Supplem. Biogr. P. 401, 402*

27. Parents: D. Balthasar Raith, S.Theol.Prof.P. O. Ecclef.Decan.&Stip.Superint. born in Schorndorff, 8 October, 1616. Patre Elia Raithio, *Cive & Salaris ibid. ob.* Died 5 Dec. 1683. And Maria Margareta, Johann Martin Rumelins, U.J.D. & Graec.Ling. Profess. Tochter. *Fischlin. P.II.p.266. feq.*

28. A daughter of Veit Jacob Neueffer, spiritual caretaker at Urach, *vid. Tab.II* and Regina Justina Pfaffin, *vid. Tab. II. Not. N.50* This Maria Margareta Neuefferin had lived at different times during their marriage, lived with Johann Ulrich Springen, *Amts.Subdtituten* at Stuttgart. They were hoping to have a son after the birth of their daughter.

29.. The father was Carl Ludwig Grückler, a clerk in Soren, the new city on the Sr. Linden.

30. Parents: Johann Adam Osiander, *Med. D. & Prof. P. Tubing. Seren. Ducis Friderici Caroli & Marchion. Brandenburg, Beyreuth, Christiani Ernesti Archiat.ac. physic.* Tubing. Born 9 November 1659. Died 23 March 1708. *Vus. Progr. Acad. & Mecnk. Taught. Lexic.p.11.p.m. 386.* And Maria Barbara Scret a von Zavorziz. This D. Johann Adam Osiander was the son of the world famous *Cancell. Tubing. D. Johann Adam Osiander* and a living brother of the highly respected Direct. Johann Osiander. *Vid. Omnino supr. Nr. 20.*

31. Vater: Johann Georg Weißer, citizen of Waiblingen.

32. These are from the first marriage: Anna Rosina Neufferin, born 1674, Died 1725. Married Johann Christoph Herborten, once the mayor and a merchant in Bietigheim; Their first son was Philipp Jacob Herborten, Merchant who left an iron factory when he died and who lived without marriage for some months with Christiana Dorothea Kohltreuterin. Sara Christina Neufferin, now deceased was betrothed to M. El. Niethammer, Pf. At Heumertingen. Regina Barbara Neufferin, and M. Johann Fridrich Pastor at Eberspach were married. Maria Catharina Neufferin *coelebs.* Anna Dorothea Neufferin. *M.Ad. Melch. Hundesbagen,* Pastor at Weissach, were married. The rest *mcil.* Johann Ludwig: Maria Elisabetha: Maria Margareta, and Fridrich all died as children. From the II marriage: Ferdinand Gottfried Neuffer, court and city apothecary, also mayor at Gochzen, married to Ernestina Salßerin von Bretten. Besides there were other siblings.

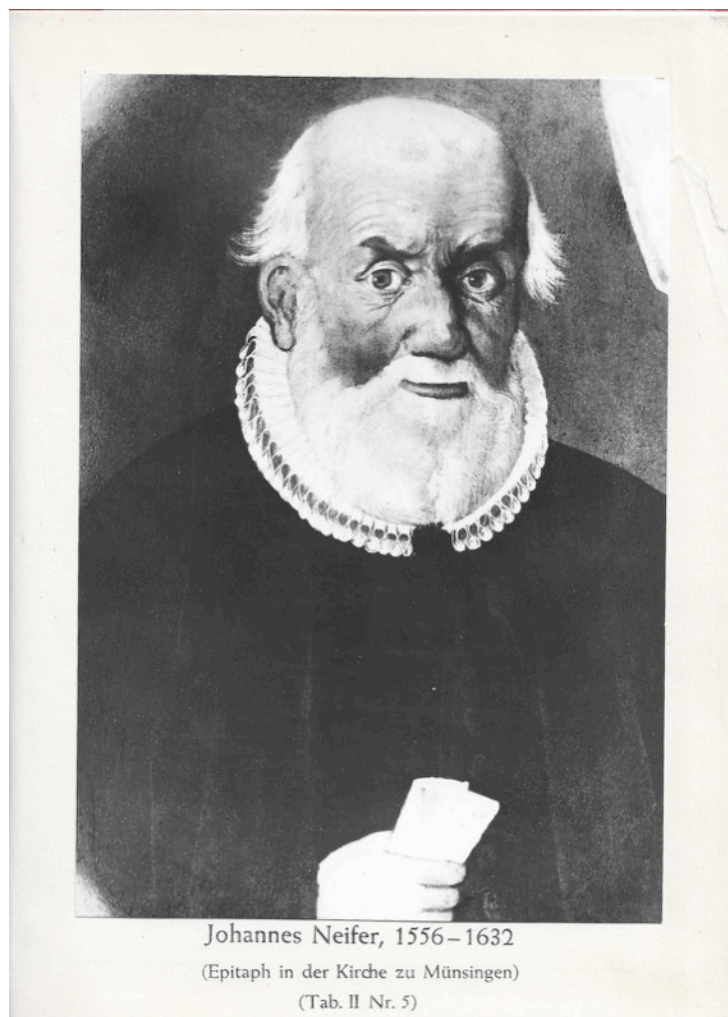

Nr. 1

Below, I have described how the Martin-ish line descended from, nr. 12. I have named this table Partem I. feu Politic, Martin Line, because it identifies the children of D. Martin Neuffer who were members in the broader world that followed political callings., and many of their descendants who studied for the clergy or spiritual life. Per Studia, vel per connubial.

2. For these see the previous Table 1 note nr. 1.

3. *Testantibus MStis. Conf.M.Cafp. zBrenderi*, Pastor at Reichenbach, funeral sermon and Personal. Given at the burial of Johann Neuffer, Clergy at Reichenbach.

4. Brederus testified 1.c. that also this Martin Neifer was the mayor of Münsingen even though he didn't use the same name.

5. His epitaph is still in the church at Münsingen . He lived to be 76 years old. *MSt. & Brender I.C.*

6. Was married to her husband for 33 years and has 12 children together. *MSt.*

7. Was married for 22 years. No children came to their union.

8. He served his merciful Lords of the highly honored House of Würtemberg in many dangerous and difficult assignments through his unwavering loyalty and service. He also benefitted his extended family and the poor as a loving father figure. Until the end of his life he cared for poor boys in his house and at his table, teaching them his giving ways.

9. A daughter of Georg Faessler, caretaker at Unter-Oewisheim, and Anna Schillerin, from the old and famous aristocrats, who for many years, served as overseer of the chambers in Stuttgart. She was married for 30 years without having any children. *Brender. I. c.*

10. A daughter of Jacob Reinbenzen, Cloister-man at Offenhausen and Catharina Beckin. *MSt. & Brender. I. c.*

11. Many would like to think he lived for a number of years in a relationship without the benefit of marriage. But there is no evidence of any of this.

12. To begin with, he was *Profess. Ill. College.* After which, *fuffragia Senat. Academ.,* also the Löbl. University and at the same time, *Superintendens Stipend. Martin. MSt. & Progr. Acad.* Also led in 1636, *Scepturum Academ. Vid. AEta publ.Jubil.il. Acad. Tub.* His *Pronepos*, M. Jacob Ludwig Neuffer, *Diac. Mezing.* Served over the kingdom of Würtemberg judicial system, in which D. Martin Neuffer with hundreds of lawyers *Citat. & Annotat.* Served, and held this position as a *singulare antiquitatis Monumentum* with great honor. NB. This D. Martin Neuffer and the above mentioned D. Johann Valetin Neuffer, the Neuffer-ish relationship and the Martin-ish and Valentin-ish lines combined. *Conf. supr. Tab. I Not. Nr. 2.*

13. The parents were: Vitus Breitschvverdt, J.U.D. Würtemberg and other positions Geh. Rath (council) and the Schwabian Lords, Confulent and Syndicus: the mother was of an aristocrat from Augsburg. *Mst. Conf. M. Burckh. Knoebels, tt.Diac.Tub. Conc. Funeb.,Personal in obitum Annae Mariae Harpprechtin.*

14. He was a good father and caretaker after becoming widowed at an early age. Father Jacob Neuffer, an official at Reichenbach. *Mst.*

16. The father is M. Johann Christoph Liesching, pastor at Möhringen by Tuebingen. He was married post mortem(?doesn't make sense) to the city clerk Laiblin.
17. She died within a few days after her husband and was the daughter of Johann Wolffin, butcher to the court in Stuttgart.

The errors that have been made here are because of ignorance and are best *deprecirt.*

Persons who died young or in fact, *ante completos annos connubiales* (not full term) were not recorded in many places.

The date of marriages had to be approximated as accurately as possible. This is also true for some dates of *tempus nativit. & mortis* (births and deaths) that could not be obtained.

It would have been too much to try to include the honorary titles, occupations and places where all of these people lived. So this is a shorter version with more descriptions of the main characters and for the most part, only the last place where each person lived.

Also, when someone from the association finds the vital information about 1. Johannes Neuffers who was *AErarii faci Curator* at Stuttgart and his daughter Agnes who at Christo. Brunnen, the Abby to St, Georg , 13 June, 1609 married (*conf. Fischl. Biogr, P. II. P.101*) 2. Johannes Neuffers, *Prof. Ill. Colleg. Tub.* (which D. Müller, *Prof. Med. Tub. S.Orat. funebr. In obit. D. Sebast, Bloffii*, held 7 December, 1627 had dedicated.)- Note: This refers to a funeral eulogy. 3. Meich. Neuffers, chairman of the council in Weinsberg, (whose wife, Margareten M. Johann Conrad Pfeil, City pastor, the same in 1633 in a printed funeral eulogy.) 4. Johann Neuffers, citizen at Böblingen whose son, Johann Friderich Neuffer Chairman of the council died 17 April 1729, and Jacob Friderich Neuffer city clerk of Mecklingen, born 21 July, 1695, who lived in marriage with Maria Barbara Ruethartin from Grossen-Heupach left in their posterity 5. Heinrich Neuffer now still living citizens of Asperg, son of Georg Neuffer, vineyards keeper in Grossen-Ingersheim. 6.
